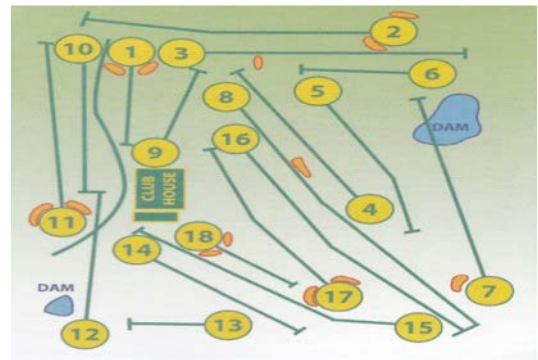


# TENTERFIELD GOLF CLUB WELCOMES VISITING GOLFERS

## HOLE DETAILS AND RULES

1 <sup>st</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)
	249	247	245	224
Par	4	4	4	4

The 1<sup>st</sup> tee is above the level of the green. The fairway plays downhill with a slight dogleg from left to right. Trees guard the right side of the fairway and trees and the road into the Club border the left. The green is guarded by a bunker on the front left and one on the front right. The green slopes from back to front and left to right. Out of bounds is at the back of the green.

2 <sup>nd</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> tee is divided by the road into the Club at the entrance and is above the level of the green. The fairway plays downhill with a dogleg right to left. Trees guard both the left and right sides of the fairway and out of bounds is down the left side from

the tee. A drain runs across the fairway at about the 100m mark. A protective screen is positioned to the right of the front tee.

The green is guarded by a bunker on the front right and one on the back left. The green has a severe slope from back to front.

3 <sup>rd</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 3<sup>rd</sup> tee is well below the level of the green. The fairway plays uphill with a slight dogleg left to right. Trees border the left and right sides of the fairway but the area around the green is open. A fairway bunker is located at about 220m from the tee. A drain is located along the right side of the fairway and a grassed drain runs across the fairway at about 120m from the tee.

The green is relatively flat with a slight slope from back to front and left to right in some areas and right to left in others.

4 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 4<sup>th</sup> tee is slightly above the level of the green. The fairway plays with a slight dogleg from left to right downhill from the tee to the 150m mark with a moderate slope from right to left. Trees border both sides of the fairway and the back of the green. A protective screen is positioned at the back left of the green.

The green is relative flat with a slight slope from back to front and right to left in some areas and left to right in others.

5 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 5<sup>th</sup> tee at about the same level as the green. The fairway plays downhill until about the 130m mark with a dogleg to the left then uphill to the green. A grassed drain runs across the fairway at about the 150m mark and a mound is positioned to the left of the green. Trees border the fairway on both sides but the green is relatively open.

The green is raised at the back and slopes from back to front and left to right.

6 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 6<sup>th</sup> tee is well above the level of the green. The fairway plays downhill and trees bordering both sides but the green is open except for trees to the far right. A drain runs across the fairway at about the 80m mark and a mound is located to the right front of the green. A protective screen is located at the front and to the right of the tee.

The green is raised at the back with a severe slope from back to front and a slight slope from left to right. Making par from behind the green is difficult.

7 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 7<sup>th</sup> blue and white tees are located on the dam wall while the red tee is located about 80m beyond dam. The fairway is relatively straight, slightly uphill and bordered by trees on both sides but the green is open. Out of bounds is beyond the left of the fairway and a bunker is positioned at the right front of the green.

The green is raised at the back left and slopes from back to front and right to left. The slope to the front

at the front third of the green is severe.

8 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 8<sup>th</sup> tee is about level with the green. The fairway plays downhill with a dogleg to the right sloping left to right, then uphill to the green. The fairway is bordered by trees on both sides. A bunker positioned to the right of the fairway about 120m from the green. There are trees close to the right front of the green but the remainder of the green is open. Mounds are positioned to the left of the fairway in near the green.

The green is raised at the back and slopes from back to front and left to right.

9 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 9<sup>th</sup> tee is below the level of the green and the fairway is relatively straight and uphill. Trees are located on the right side of the fairway and at the back of the green.

The green is raised on the left and slopes from back to front, right to left in some areas and left to right in others.

10 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 10<sup>th</sup> tee is above the level of the green. The fairway plays downhill with a slight dogleg to the right and a slope from right to left nearing the green. Trees border both sides of the fairway and the Club entrance road runs down the right. Mounds are located at the left and right of the green and out of bounds is at the back.

The green slopes from back to front and right to left, and falls sharply at the front left edge.

11 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 11<sup>th</sup> tee is slightly below the level of the green. The fairway plays uphill, downhill with a slope from left to right then level to the green. Trees and located on both sides of the fairway and out of bounds is along the full length of the right side to the course maintenance facility. Bunkers guard the green on the front right and on the left. A mound is located in front of the left bunker.

The green is raised on the right and at the back with slopes from back to front and left to right. The slope

becomes more intense towards the right of the green.

12 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 12<sup>th</sup> tee is elevated well above the green. The fairway plays downhill with a slight dogleg from left to right. The fairway has trees down the left and, trees and the course maintenance facility on the right. Past the course maintenance facility, the fairway is fairly open on the right with out of bounds running the full length of the fairway and at the back of the green. A dam is located in front of and to the right of the green.

The green is raised at the back and slopes from back to front and left to right. The slope becomes more intense at the front right of the green.

13 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 13<sup>th</sup> tee is about level with the green. Trees along with out of bounds are located on the right of the fairway. Trees are on the left of the fairway but make way for an open area to the left of the green. A drain runs from left of the green back towards the front tee. A concrete path runs from the back tee almost to the green.

The green slopes from front to back and right to left in some areas and left to right in others.

The 14<sup>th</sup> tee is well below the level of the green and the fairway is relatively straight uphill but slopes from right to left nearing the green. Trees are located on both sides of the tees and to the left, back and right of the green. The green is raised on the left.

The green slopes from back to front and left to right in some areas and right to left in others.

The 15<sup>th</sup> tee is slightly higher than the green. The fairway plays downhill with a dogleg right to left then uphill to the green. Trees border both sides of the fairway and the green. Out of bounds is on the right of the fairway up the hill and on the right of the green.

The green slopes from back to front and left to right in some areas and left to right in others.

16 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 16<sup>th</sup> tee is slightly higher than the green. The fairway plays downhill with a slight dogleg left to right then uphill to the green. The fairway slopes right to left at the start of the dogleg and left to right to the green. Mounds are located in front of and to the right of the green and to the left of the green. The green is raised on the right and at the back and slopes from the back to the front and from left to right.

17 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 17<sup>th</sup> tee is elevated well above the green. The fairway plays downhill with a slight dogleg from right to left. Trees border the left and right of the fairway and the back of the green. A mound is located on the right of the fairway at about the 90m mark, and the green is guarded by a bunker on the front left and on the right of the green.

The green slopes from back to front and left to right in some areas and right to left in others.

18 <sup>th</sup> Hole	Blue (m)	White (m)	Red (m)	Pink (m)

The 18<sup>th</sup> tee is well below the green. The fairway is relatively straight with two rocks located on the fairway in front of the green and trees bordering both sides and right of the green. A sand bunker guards the left front of the green while a grass bunker is on the front right.

The green slopes from back to front and left to right in some areas and right to left in others.

### Yellow Markers

Male social players are requested to play from the yellow tee markers in-lieu of the white or blue. The area bound by the blue and white tee markers is only to be used for club specific competitions.

### Local Rules

Local Rules are displayed in the Club House on the Notice Board near the golf computer and on the back of the score card. If required, additional Local Rules will be displayed on the Club House Notice Board.

### Cart Etiquette

Cart operators are reminded not to drive within five metres of a putting green or a bunker unless on a path and, not to drive over wet areas, tees, greens, or mounds.

Carts must be parked at the sides of greens and not left unattended in front of a green.

### **Mobile Phones and Audio Devices**

Whilst on the golf course, the use of a mobile telephone or audio device by a player or caddie is a distraction to other players and is inconsiderate. If a telephone rings or an audio device is playing, it is deemed in use; accordingly, mobile telephones or audio devices shall remain either turned off or on mute during play.

### **Suspension of Play - Lightning**

A player must discontinue play if he/she believes there is a danger from lightning and not rely on the Committee to ensure safety.

In the event of lightning near the course or the course becomes unplayable, the Committee will sound a siren. The following signals apply:

- **One prolonged note of the siren** - Discontinue play immediately (dangerous situation).
- **Three consecutive notes of the siren, repeated** - Discontinue play (course unplayable).
- **Two short notes of the siren, repeated** - Resume play.

### **Pace of Play**

A round of golf is meant to be played at a prompt pace. Each player should recognize that their pace of play is likely to affect how long it will take other players to play their rounds, including both those in the player's own group and those in following groups.

Players are encouraged to allow faster groups to play through.

### **Course Rules**

Players must carry a bucket containing sand to fill divots made by them and others.

Players are required to place empty cans and bottles, bottle tops and other forms of litter in the bins provided.

### **Pitch Marks**

When repairing pitch marks, insert a tee or a pitch fork at a 45-degree angle behind the pitch mark and push towards the centre of the indentation. Work around the mini crater in this way and you'll notice the grass starting to cover the exposed soil. Gently tap the repaired area with your putter.

### **Divots**

If you're unlucky to lift a chunk of grass from a tee, fairway or the rough, use the sand provided by the Club to repair the damage.

Fill the hole and level to the height of the surrounding soil by dragging your foot over the affected area. Do not leave a sand castle, particularly on the tees.

### **Bunker Rake Location**

The rake must not be left under the back edge of the bunker. A ball trapped by the rake in this position may be difficult to replace on the original spot once it has moved after the rake has been shifted.

Nothing in the Rules of Golf allows a player to press the ball into the sand to make it stay in position.

Since the player cannot place the ball in conformity with the rules, the ball must be dropped outside the bunker under the penalty of one stroke.

Greenside bunkers should be raked in the direction of play or towards the centre of the green. Fairway bunkers should be raked parallel to play from tee to green.

After soothing and exiting a green side bunker, players are requested to leave the rake in the bunker with the head facing towards the centre of the green and, the end of the handle resting on the grassed edge furthest from the green. When this procedure is adopted, a player can easily collect the rake without entering the bunker.

### **Ball Recovery**

Players are requested not to remove a ball from a hole using a putter head. Hole damage and hole liner movement can occur.

### **Call-Up**

For safety and legal reasons, calling-up on par three holes is prohibited.

### **Code of Conduct (abridged)**

Players shall:

- Respect the rights of others to enjoy the Club's facilities and services.
- Follow the instructions given by Club management and/or Directors.
- Refrain from:
  - behaving in any way that may damage the reputation of the Club as a friendly environment.
  - verbal and physical threats to others, either in person, or through social media or otherwise.
  - Disorderly or disruptive behaviours; obscene and/or offensive language, gestures or insults.
  - wearing obscene and/or offensive clothing.
- Adhere to the commonly accepted standards of golfing etiquette as well as the Rules of Golf, Local Rules and By-laws.
- Comply with the Club's policies, signage and lawful directions of employees, including within the Club House and associated facilities, and on the golf course.
